Dear Landowner:

The Board of Supervisors acting as drainage district Trustees have joined with six other county boards of supervisors to work with The Iowa Nutrient Research & Education Council (INREC), Iowa State University, and drainage engineers Bolton & Menk, Inc. (BMI) to develop a database of potential water quality wetlands projects that could be constructed in drainage districts in the seven counties. This consortium was successful in securing a grant from the Iowa Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship (IDALS) to in part utilize available engineering tools and drainage district records to find a number of these potential tile-zone wetland sites, primarily in drainage districts, in each county and to share conceptual designs and funding opportunities for these wetland sites with the affected landowners. The goal of the project is to provide to the IDALS a substantial list of actionable wetland sites for which informed landowners have expressed good interest in pursuing in the future.

In 2018 the Iowa legislature authorized the annual spending of \$15 million of sales tax revenue over 10 years for rural water quality improvement projects, including tile-zone water quality wetlands. This funding stream will become available to the IDALS in 2021. Over the decade that the funds will be available, the IDALS will select, and offer funding to, the better projects that have been presented for funding. It is then that the several potential wetland projects on the database that the 7 Counties Project Team intends to provide to the IDALS will be among those considered for funding. We anticipate that many of these desired wetland projects will be offered funding.

Approximately 23 potential tile-zone wetland sites have been located by our project team in Story County. We are contacting you because all or part of one of those potential sites has been located on your property. The approximate location is shown on the enclosed map. You are invited to attend the scheduled meeting with BMI engineers, INREC staff and members of the board to learn more about this opportunity, either in person or virtually.

At this meeting there will be a brief presentation regarding the ambitious 7 Counties Project, the engineering design of tile-zone water quality wetlands, and how this supports the Iowa Nutrient Reduction Strategy. You will be able to sit down with an engineer to discuss the details of the potential wetland on your farm and to have your questions answered. Information will also be confidentially provided regarding the potential incentive payment(s) and funding that will be available for your wetland site. The IDALS has historically provided 100% cost-share for water quality wetland construction costs along with very reasonable incentive payments to compensate for land taken out of production.

Our purpose is to give you enough information to help you decide if you would like to have your potential wetland project placed in the IDALS data base for future funding offers from the IDALS. No firm commitment will be expected of you on that day. To put your project on the IDALS data base the Project Team will need a general indication that you are interested in further considering the project. Your final decision to commit to the project will only be needed in the future should you be contacted by the IDALS. This is totally your decision with no pressure. If the site lays across a property line your neighbor's positive indication will also be needed for the site to make the IDALS data base. They have also been contacted.

Rural landowners are being asked to do more to reduce row crop farming's adverse impacts upon water quality in our counties and state. We recognize that most landowners and their tenants are well-intentioned stewards caught up in an intense production system that requires their farms to be highly productive and efficient to make a living while maintaining soil health and fertility and water quality. We also understand that not all farms are positioned to be able to take on a water quality wetland project at this time.

The Story County Board of Supervisors, acting as drainage district Trustees, advocate for and will support, as the law allows, voluntary water quality projects initiated by landowners in the

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several drainage districts in Story County. The board will also guard the drainage rights of you and your neighbors in carefully reviewing for the drainage districts all future applications for the construction of these tile-zone water quality wetlands.

The scheduled session is noted at the top of this letter. The session is intended to have a come and go format and it is not necessary for all to appear at the beginning of the session. Ideally your time there will be no more than an hour. However, all should arrange to arrive at least half an hour before the end of the session.

We hope that you will be able to meet with members of the 7 Counties Project Team and hear the details of this important opportunity. We ask every landowner to RSVP using the enclosed form. If you are interested but cannot attend the session, please let us know that you do want to meet, and we can schedule a time for you to meet with the engineers at another time at their office at no cost to you. For interested landowners who live out of the area individual telephone meetings can be arranged. If you are not interested, we ask that you so indicate and return the form.

"Pursuant to Iowa Code §331.304(8) and §727.2, the Story County Board of Supervisors may grant a permit for the use or explosion of display fireworks upon a written application when the display fireworks will be handled by a competent operator. The operator shall handle and discharge the display fireworks according to applicable law and manufacturer's recommendations, and shall operate safely under all circumstances. The permittee/operator certifies that s/he has authority to operate display fireworks on and over the location listed in the permit where the display is to occur. Any such permit shall be void if the use occurs when a 'burn ban' is in effect or if conditions are conducive to fire. Any permit is valid only in the unincorporated areas of Story County, Iowa, and this permit is immediately void if any display fireworks are operated over any part of a city, airport, airstrip or outside of Story County (except non-nuisance airborne smoke that may drift from the display location). Any permit so issued does not immunize the applicant or operator from complying with all laws and regulations concerning the purchase, transportation, possession, storage, firing, and discharge of explosives and fireworks. The permittee/operator shall comply with lawful directives of any peace officer and emergency services worker and the permittee/operator shall produce the permit upon request of any peace officer or emergency services worker. The applicant/permittee and/or operator shall assume all liability and risk of loss, injury or death to any entity or person associated with the handling and/or discharge of the display fireworks, and agrees to indemnify and hold Story County, its agents and employees, harmless from any and all liability associated with the use or explosion of display fireworks. The permittee/operator specifically and voluntarily agrees to the foregoing and understands the granting or denial of this application is a matter of discretion resting solely with the Story County Board of Supervisors, its agents and/or assigns."

CONTRACT FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into the 1st day of July, 2021, by and between **STORY COUNTY, IOWA**, an Iowa Municipal Corporation whose mailing address and telephone number is 900 Sixth Street, Nevada, Iowa 50201, telephone 515-382-7200, organized and existing pursuant to the laws of the State of Iowa (hereinafter called "County") and the Ames Economic Development Commission, an adjunct of the Ames Chamber of Commerce (hereinafter called "the AEDC") whose mailing address and telephone number is 304 Main Street, Ames, Iowa 50010, telephone 515-232-2310.

WITNESSETH THAT:

WHEREAS, the County desires to purchase certain services from said organization in lieu of hiring additional permanent staff and expending additional County funds to accomplish these services;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto have agreed and do agree as follows:

I

PURPOSE AND INTENT

The purpose of this Agreement is to procure for the County and its citizens in the unincorporated areas of Story County and those communities with 2010 *US Census* population of less than 2,000 persons wholly located in Story County ("Story County and communities") certain economic development-related services as hereinafter described and set out; to establish the methods, procedures, terms and conditions governing payment by the County for such services; and, to establish other duties, responsibilities, terms and conditions mutually undertaken and agreed to by the parties hereto in consideration of the services to be performed and monies paid.

II

SCOPE OF SERVICES

A. In consideration for the payment of \$85,000 in accordance with Section III, the AEDC shall provide the following economic development related services to the County and its citizens in the unincorporated areas of Story County and those communities with 2010 *US Census* population of less than 2,000 persons wholly located in Story County ("Story County and communities") during the term of this agreement:

- 1) The AEDC will serve as the lead contact for business representatives hoping to locate in or to expand in Story County and communities. In this capacity the President of the AEDC will respond to information requests, coordinate the completion and submittal of state and local incentive applications, and show available industrial and commercial sites to prospects.
- 2) The AEDC will change the title of their main representative providing these scope of services to eliminate any confusion or potential confusion that this position is employed by Story County and/or has any employment relationship, management responsibilities or independent decision-making authority related to his or her assigned tasks and obligations under this contract.
- 3) The AEDC will visit annually with all major companies to identify challenges and opportunities facing businesses in Story County and communities.

- 4) The AEDC will serve as the primary marketing entity for business recruitment to highlight Story County and communities.
- 5) The AEDC will deploy an aggressive marketing campaign that will focus on targeted industries such as ag-biotechnology and advanced manufacturing businesses that do not overtax our infrastructure.
- 6) The AEDC will assess, update and implement the economic development recommendations of Story County and communities' Comprehensive Plan(s); the AEDC will educate management, staff and elected officials on market trends affecting Story County and communities' economic condition(s) and provide guidance on policies necessary to improve economic conditions.
- 7) The AEDC will assist communities as needed with key community development and infrastructure initiatives that support or enhance economic development opportunities, providing resources for information to communities for federal, state and local funding programs, and provide information and guidance for new and existing businesses in obtaining financial incentives, if applicable.
- 8) The AEDC will actively pursue new retail, industrial, and commercial businesses to occupy vacant or underutilized properties within Story County and communities.
- 9) The AEDC will develop a database of key contacts for major commercial and industrial companies suitable for recruitment to Story County and communities.
- 10) The AEDC will serve as a liaison for Story County and communities to local businesses to support their retention and to encourage their expansion within Story County and communities.
- 11) The AEDC will develop and maintain a comprehensive database of commercial and industrial properties within Story County and communities available for development or reuse. Story County will receive a current copy of the aforementioned database in a standard format two-weeks before the termination of this contract.
- 12) The AEDC will develop and distribute hardcopy marketing materials and collaborate with Story County and communities' IT professionals for electronic version marketing materials.
- 13) The AEDC will maintain information regarding grants, loans and incentives for business development with Story County and communities.
- 14) The AEDC will report quarterly to the Story County Board of Supervisors on related activities beginning in July 2021.

B. Quarterly reports, written reports and/or Power Point presentations and supporting documentation are due by Thursday, 1 pm, prior to the regularly scheduled Tuesday Board of Supervisors meeting at which an oral report or presentation is to be made.

Reports will include explanations of why specific activities and programs are undertaken plus who is likely to directly benefit and estimations or projections of the immediate to two-year economic impacts.

In addition, the AEDC will keep the Supervisors, individually and/or collectively up-to-date on specific efforts and projects as requested.

AEDC will recognize the Story County Board of Supervisors' intent to take a lead role in facilitating housing rehabilitation and new housing construction for residents in the low to average-income ranges in Story County.

AEDC will provide support and assistance on housing issues, cooperating with any organizational or leadership efforts the Board of Supervisors undertakes and coordinating with any housing initiatives, it may implement.

The primary representative of AEDC responsible for performing or coordinating the fulfillment of the scope of services will not engage in any local, state or federal lobbying activities on behalf of the Ames Economic Development Commission and the Ames Chamber of Commerce, and/or their affiliates.

III

METHOD OF PAYMENT

A. Payment for services will be made by County according to the following schedule:

July 1, 2021	\$25,000
October 1, 2021	\$20,000
January 1, 2022	\$20,000
April 1, 2022	\$20,000

B. On or before June 30, 2021, the AEDC will provide electronically, itemization of costs incurred. AEDC will make available all receipts if requested by the County.

C. The maximum total amount payable by the County under this agreement is \$85,000 as detailed in the SCOPE OF SERVICES (Section II of this contract), and no greater amount shall be paid.

IV

FINANCIAL ACCOUNTING AND ADMINISTRATION

A. All monies disbursed under this Agreement shall be accounted for by the accrual method of accounting.

B. Monies disbursed to AEDC by the County will be deposited by AEDC in an account under the AEDC's name, with a bank located in Story County, Iowa. CONTRACT FOR WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into the 1st day of July, 2021, by and between **STORY COUNTY, IOWA**, an Iowa Municipal Corporation whose mailing address and telephone number is 900 Sixth Street, Nevada, Iowa 50201, telephone 515-382-7200, organized and existing pursuant to the laws of the State of Iowa (hereinafter called "County") and the Ames Economic Development Commission, an adjunct of the Ames Chamber of Commerce (hereinafter called "the AEDC") whose mailing address and telephone number is 304 Main Street, Ames, Iowa 50010, telephone 515-232-2310.

WITNESSETH THAT:

WHEREAS, the County desires to purchase certain services from said organization in lieu of hiring additional permanent staff and expending additional County funds to accomplish these services.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto have agreed and do agree as follows:

I

PURPOSE AND INTENT

The purpose of this Agreement is to procure for the County and its citizens assistance in developing and promoting workforce development strategies, including the project management of the Home Base Iowa initiative as hereinafter described and set out; to establish the methods, procedures, terms and conditions governing payment by the County for such services; and, to establish other duties, responsibilities, terms and conditions mutually undertaken and agreed to by the parties hereto in consideration of the services to be performed and monies paid.

II

SCOPE OF SERVICES

A. In consideration for the payment of \$40,000 in accordance with Section III, the AEDC shall provide the following services to the County and its citizens during the term of this agreement the AEDC agrees to:

- 1) Report quarterly to the Story County Board of Supervisors on related activities. Reports will include explanations of why specific activities and programs are undertaken and likely beneficiaries. In addition, the AEDC will keep the Supervisors, individually and/or collectively up-to-date on specific efforts and projects as requested.
- 2) Identify target targeted workforce for specific priorities and programs;
- 3) Identify workforce education and training objectives;
- 4) Construct linkages with the private sector, including those businesses and companies located in unincorporated Story County;
- 5) Design and implement a relevant workforce education and training strategy strategies;
- 6) Coordinate and work cooperatively with other work force initiatives and/or programs supported or funded by the BOS when requested.
- 7) Conduct ongoing monitoring and evaluation;
- 8) Maintain database of inquiries into the Home Base Iowa initiative;
- 9) Design marketing materials for Home Base Iowa initiative and actively market said program through variety of ways, including, but not limited to, written campaigns, social media, and print media; and
- 10) The main person responsible for performing or coordinating fulfillment of the scope of services will not engage in any local, state or federal lobbying activities on behalf of the Ames Economic Development Commission and the Ames Chamber of Commerce, and/or their affiliates.

III
METHOD OF PAYMENT

- A. Payment for services will be made by County according to the following schedule:
 - July 31, 2021 - \$15,000
 - October 1, 2021 - \$15,000
 - January 1, 2022 - \$10,000
- B. On or before June 30, 2022, the AEDC will provide electronically, itemization of costs incurred. AEDC will make available all receipts if requested by the County.
- C. The maximum total amount payable by the County under this agreement is \$40,000 as detailed in the SCOPE OF SERVICES (Section II of this contract), and no greater amount shall be paid.





Section 16 – Reconstitution of the Continuity of Operations/Continuity of Government Plan states the following:

- Reconstitution procedures will commence when the Reconstitution Manager or his/her authorized representative ascertains that the emergency has ended and is unlikely to reoccur, in consultation with the Emergency Management Coordinator and CCMT Coordinator, and recommends such action to the Board of Supervisors. The reconstitution plans are viable regardless of the level of disruption that originally prompted implementation of this Plan. Through the work performed by the CCMT, the CCMT Coordinator will provide information on the status of County operations and overall recovery to the Board of Supervisors so that they can determine the need and appropriateness to consolidate and/or discontinue County services and ascertain the closure of County buildings.

On Wednesday, June 23, 2021, Staff recommended that the CCMT recommend to the Board of Supervisors the deactivation of the COOP/COG. At that meeting, the CCMT voted to recommend such action.

Recommendation

The CCMT and Staff recommend the deactivation of the Story County Continuity of Operations/Continuity of Government Plan effective Tuesday, June 29, 2021, following consideration of the Board of Supervisors.

In the event that personnel or resources of the Sheriff's Office are redirected to respond to an emergency or urgent call away from Contractor's venue, or if circumstances require additional resources/personnel to maintain order and safety at the venue covered by this agreement, the parties will later endeavor to negotiate a fair and reasonable accommodation which may include but is not necessarily limited to refund of any prepaid services not delivered by the Service Provider, or additional payment from the contractor.

ANIMAL RESCUE SERVICE CONTRACT

This contract and Agreement is entered into by and between Story County, Iowa and the City of Cambridge, Iowa pursuant to the authority, and by the procedures of Chapter 28E, Code of Iowa.

1. Purpose:

Under this contract, Story County shall provide said City with services of domestic animal rescue as set forth more specifically in succeeding paragraphs herein with the exception of 2(e) and (f). Story County will not provide service with regard to wild animals except as noted below in the Scope of Services, and in the sole discretion of Story County.

2. Scope of services (pursuant to Story County Code of Ordinances):

- a. Transportation of animals impounded by the contracting city.
- b. Shelter and board for the impounded animals.
- c. Issuance of applicable impoundment charges on impounded animals pursuant to Story County Code of Ordinances.
- d. Cat, dog, and other small domesticated animal adoption service for appropriately impounded animals.
- e. Investigation and disposition of rabid, sick or injured animals.
- f. Supervision of quarantine procedures and rabies testing.
- g. Collection and impounding of City trapped cats.
- h. Arrange for emergency veterinary care or provision of first-aid treatment.
- i. Provision of humane euthanasia of unclaimed cats and dogs pursuant to Iowa Code 351.37.
- j. Rescue of animals in unusual or emergency circumstances (i.e. flood waters, fire, etc., with permission from appropriate City Official).
- k. One letter sent to resident of said City when requested by said City and only after prior attempts at resolution by City.

Any other animal control related problem may be dealt with at the Animal Control Officer's discretion.

The City understands that all service is subject to the Animal Control Officer's availability and discretion with the expressed approval of a City Official, except in emergencies.

3. Consideration: (Quarterly billing)

The City will pay Story County, Iowa, based on the following fee schedule:

- a. \$50.00 per officer involved, per trip between the hours of 3:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m., Monday through Friday, all day Saturday, Sunday and holidays.
- b. \$25.00 per trip for investigations (regardless of whether or not an animal is detained), confining an animal, and other services as needed.
- c. \$6.50 per day up to a maximum of seven (7) days per unclaimed dog for boarding and transportation costs.
- d. \$5.50 per day up to a maximum of seven (7) days per unclaimed cat for boarding and transportation costs.
- e. \$5.50 per day up to a maximum of seven (7) days per unclaimed exotic animal for boarding and transportation costs.

To the Board of Supervisors, Story County, Iowa:

The Colo Telephone Company, incorporated under the laws of Iowa, with its principal place of business at 303 Main St Colo IA, does hereby make application requesting permission to occupy certain portions of public right-of-way and that the County Engineer be directed to establish the location of lines of transmission of fiber optic cable on secondary route Lincoln HWY, from 650th ST and Lincoln HWY to 65290 Lincoln HWY, a distance of .32 miles.

Agreements: The utility company, corporation, applicant, permittee, or licensee, (hereinafter referred to as the permittee) agrees that the following stipulations shall govern under this permit.





Section 3. The total maximum transfer from the rural services fund to the secondary roads fund shall not exceed \$ 2,600,000 ;




